Open Session

- **1.** Call to Order: Lyn-Kew made a motion to go into open session. Cassidy seconded the Motion. The motion passed unanimously. The open session began at 9:00 a.m.

4. Education (Dr. Sheila Green, Education Consultant)

Items A-B were reviewed and recommended for approval by the Practice and Education Committee

- A. Out of State programs/ Substantial Equivalency
 - 1. Capscare Academy for HealthCare Education: Lyn-Kew made a motion to not to approve Capscare Academy. Cassidy seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. The school was revisited later in the session, representatives for the school and students joined the session online. Lyn-Kew made a motion to rescind the vote taken this morning. Cassidy seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously to rescind and bring Capscare back to the Board meeting in December.
 - 2. Virginia School of Nursing and Medical Institute: Lyn-Kew made a motion not to approve Virginia School of Nursing and Medical Institute as it does not meet the regulatory requirements for approval. Cassidy seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- B. Action Plan Reports Re: FY 2020 NCLRX-RN Performance
 - 1. Baltimore City Community College: Lyn-Kew made a motion to approve the performance improvement plan. Cassidy seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
 - 2. Notre Dame University of Maryland: Lyn-Kew made a motion to approve the recommendations of the Practice and Education committee to accept the action plan. Cassidy seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
 - 3. Washington Adventist University: Lyn-Kew made a motion to approve the action plan as outlined. Cassidy seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. Cassidy made a motion to approve the Practice and Education committee to complete the site visit by September 30, 2021. Lyn-Kew seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.
- **5. Practice** (Monica Mentzer, Manager, Practice)
 - A. Monthly and quarterly stats were provided.
- **6. Certification** (Jaray Richardson, Manager, Certification)
 - A. None.
- 7. Licensure and Advanced Practice (Shetarah Goodwin, HR Liaison/Manager, Licensure)
 - A. Monthly and quarterly stats were provided.

8. Legislative Affairs (Rhonda Scott, Deputy Director)

A. Legislative Updates

- 1. Shirley Nathan-Pulliam Health Equity Act:
 - i. Requires the creation of the commission of Health Equity connecting all departments of government and reviews data collected by the Office of Minority Health and Health Disparities and Maryland Health Care Commission. Allows the commission to establish an advisory committee.
 - ii. Public Health Race and Ethnicity Information: Requires Health Occupations Board and Maryland Healthcare Commission to collect data including racial and ethnic composition of those who hold the license or certificate issued by the Health Occupations Board. The Board will need to track the data, as well as collect it, to have an annual report.
 - iii. Implicit Bias Training and the Office f Minority Health and Disparity: requires the cultural and linguistic healthcare professional competency program to apply a prudent and implicit bias training under Health Occupations Licensure and Certification. Upon renewal the applicant will have to provide the Board with this information. It is attached to the renewal and we will have to update the online application. This should not only be a responsibility of the Board as it will be a large undertaking.
- 2. LR0987 Health Occupations Delegations of Tasks: originally this bill needed to be reintroduced. The Board submitted a letter of support for the amendments of this bill. The bill allows nurse practitioners the ability to delegate nursing or other technical tasks to an assistant.
- 3. Certified Nursing Assistants Certificate Renewal Refresher course: bill will now state regulations to specify circumstances of nursing assistant renewal as a condition of renewal is required to complete either an approved training program or refresher training program. Number of didactic instruction hours and clinical hours must be approved. Regulations must be consistent with federal law. This came about because of the GNA.

9. Direct-Entry Midwives and Electrology (Monica Mentzer, Manager, Practice)

Item 9A was reviewed and recommended for approval by the Direct-Entry Midwifery Advisory Committee.

A. Summary of annual data collection forms submitted by licensed direct-entry midwives for the Board's annual report of licensed direct-entry midwives. Lyn-Kew made a motion to not make any recommendations at this time concerning question three due to not having enough information. Cassidy seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously. Lyn-Kew made a motion to not make any

recommendations concerning question two due to lack of information and support. Cassidy seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

10. Quarterly Reports

A. None.

11. Other

- A. Certified Nurse Specialist Prescriptive Authority
 - 1. Request the Board move forward with updating COMAR with the proposed regulations, replacing the current Special Practice for Clinical Nurse Specialist to the actual scope under which they practice.
- B. Maryland Cannabis Commission Guidelines for Administration of Medical Cannabis to Qualifying Students
 - 1. Proposed amendment to COMAR 10.27.11.01 to add the admission of medical cannabis in schools to a list of exclusions from the regulatory nursing delegation requirements. Gibbon-Baker made a motion to support the proposed amendment presented by the Maryland Medical Cannabis Committee. Lyn-Kew seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

C. Music Therapy Licensure

1. Maryland State Task Force asked the Board to consider a licensed profession under the Board. The rationale is that the education clinical settings of nursing and music therapy are the similar. Secondly, the medical setting nursing staff can be a referral source for music therapy services. Lyn-Kew made a motion to defer back that this is not under the Board's expertise and maybe another agency can spearhead it. Cassidy seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

Adjournment: President Gary Hicks walked through the written statement required by the Open Meetings Act to close an open session. The written statement is attached. At 11:30am, Lyn-Kew made a motion to close the open session pursuant to the statutory authority and reasons cited in the written statement. Cassidy seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously.

June 28, 2023 Closed Session Summary
