

Reinstatement of licensure or certification

Under sections 8-319 and 8-6a-10(a)(c) of the Maryland Nurse Practice Act (NPA), the Board may reinstate a license or certificate subject to terms and conditions the Board considers necessary, or deny the reinstatement. The Board may reinstate a license or certificate, if the applicant meets minimum requirements for reinstatement, as established by the Board. The NPA requires the applicant to provide a formal written petition for reinstatement including:

- A completed renewal application
- Payment of the Board's renewal fee
- Satisfactory evidence of the minimal practice requirements
- Proof of completion of a criminal history record check

To petition the Board for consideration of reinstatement, submit the written request with requirements to:

You may also provide additional supporting documents that demonstrate you are able to safely practice with respect to the conduct that led to the Board's sanctioned discipline against the license or certificate. The Board considers all submitted documentation and evidence along with your formal written petition for reinstatement. A final decision on your written request is mailed to you.
