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ORDER FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION OF LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE LICENSE PURSUANT TO SECTION 10-226(e)(2) OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE ACT

The Maryland Board of Nursing (the "Board") hereby orders the **SUMMARY SUSPENSION** of the license of **SAFFIE DAFFIA**, (the "Respondent"), License Number **LP54555** to practice licensed practical nursing in the State of Maryland. The Board takes this action pursuant to the authority of Maryland Code Ann., State Government Article ("SG") § 10-226(c)(2) (2021 Repl. Vol.), which provides:

- (2) A unit may order summarily the suspension of a license if the unit:
 - (i) finds that the public, health, safety, or welfare imperatively requires emergency action; and
 - (ii) promptly gives the licensee:
 - 1. Written notice of the suspension, the finding and the reasons that support the finding; and
 - 2. An opportunity to be heard.

The Board has reason, as set forth below, to find that the public health, safety, or welfare imperatively requires emergency action ("SG") § 10-226(c) (2).

INVESTIGATIVE FINDINGS AND REASONS IN SUPPORT OF SUMMARY SUSPENSION

Based on investigatory information obtained by, received by and made known to and available to the Board, the Board has reason to believe that the following facts are true:¹

1. On June 6, 2019, the Respondent was issued a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse ("LPN") in the State of Maryland, license number LP54555. The Respondent's license is currently active and is scheduled to expire on April 28, 2023. The Compact² status of the Respondent's Maryland LPN license is "Multistate." According to the Maryland Board's MyLicense Office ("MYLO") database, the Respondent's current address is in the State of Maryland.³

INITIAL APPLICATION FOR LPN BY EXAM

- 2. On or about July 21, 2016, the Respondent submitted an online Maryland Application for Exam of LPN License ("LPN Application").
- 3. On the LPN Application, the Respondent indicated that she graduated from an LPN program located in Woodbridge, Virginia (the "LPN School") on June 28, 2013.
- 4. On the LPN Application, the Respondent affirmed and agreed to the following statement: "I affirm that the contents of this document are accurate to the best of my knowledge." The

Code Ann., Health Occ. § 8-7A-01.3(h) and § 8-7A-01.3(m) respectively, "Home state" means the party state that is the nurse's primary state of residence and, "Party state" means any state that has adopted this Compact.

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Respondent was advised that "providing false or misleading information may result in disciplinary

action by the Board, and may result in denial of licensure."

LPN SCHOOL

5. On July 21, 2010, the Virginia Board of Nursing approved a Consent Order, ordering that

the LPN School be placed on Conditional Provisional Approval for not less than one (1) year,

subject to terms and conditions. The Consent Order was signed by LPN School's Program Director

("Director").

6. On May 15, 2012, the Virginia Board of Nursing approved a Consent Order, signed by the

Director. The May 15, 2012 - Consent Order orders that:

[LPN School's] approval to operate a practical nursing education program in a.

Virginia is WITHDRAWN. [LPN School] shall cease operations no later than June

30, 2013, when all students shall either have graduated or transferred to an approved

program.

b. [LPN School] shall not admit any new or transfer students.

LPN SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT

7. On or about August 25, 2021, the Board issued a Subpoena Duces Tecum ("Subpoena") to

the Respondent commanding her to produce and provide to the Board copies of transcripts from

all schools attended for any LPN program, transcripts from all schools attended for any RN

program, clinical rotations documentation from all schools attended for any LPN program, clinical

rotations documentation from all schools attended for any RN program, and proof of school

attendance.

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8. The only transcript provided by the Respondent was an Official Transcript which listed the school as the LPN School. It is signed by the Program Director ("Director")⁴ and dated June 28, 2013, and provides the following information:

⁴ On or about July 8, 2021, in the U.S. District Court of Maryland, Director was indicted on charges of Conspiracy to Commit Health Care Fraud; Conspiracy to Commit False Statements Relating to Health Care Matters and False Statements Relating to Health Care Matters. According to the Criminal Complaint, Director conspired with two other individuals and submitted false statements relating to health care matters by working together to sell fraudulent transcripts and diplomas that indicate that various individuals completed necessary courses and clinical hours to obtain nursing degrees and coached these unqualified individuals to pass the nursing board exam.

THE BOARD'S INVESTIGATION

- 9. In a letter dated September 8, 2021, the Board's staff was notified by Facility 1, "we regret to inform you that after searching our records, we were unable to locate any school agreement for clinical rotations with [LPN School]."
- 10. On August 5, 2021, a Board Investigator contacted the General Counsel for Facility 2 and Facility 3, requesting information on any agreements with LPN School. On August 5, 2021, the General Counsel responded by email, stating "I searched our contracts database and do not find any contracts with [LPN School]. Additionally, as a skilled nursing facility, I do not believe we would have hosted clinicals for surgical nursing."
- 11. On August 6, 2021, a Board Investigator contacted Facility 4's Executive Director by phone. Executive Director stated that Facility 4 does not offer OB/GYN or pediatric care and that the program offers services to troubled teens, there are no nurses on staff, and the program does not offer any medical services.

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12. On August 25, 2021, the Board's staff was notified by email that Facility 5 "does not have

any affiliation or contracts with any nursing institute for any clinical hours."

13. On or about September 21, 2021, the Board Investigator conducted an interview of the

Respondent under oath. The Respondent stated the following during the interview:

a. She currently works as an LPN for an Agency where she provides care to a

client that has "CHF" (congested heart failure) and a tracheotomy in a home

setting. She stated that as part of her job she administers medications

through a g-tube, gives g-tube feedings, and performs ADLs.

b. She attended the LPN School in Woodbridge, Virginia in 2012. She started

taking classes on April 16, 2012, and then graduated on June 28, 2013.

c. She paid \$9,000 to \$10,000 for the LPN School and paid in cash

installments.

d. She said she had to finish paying for the school before she received her

transcript. She said she finished paying in December 2013.

e. She went to school four days a week from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

f. After she completed her nursing fundamentals course, she did the nursing

fundamentals clinical at a nursing home in Virginia. She went to the clinical

Monday through Friday 6:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. "for one week." As part of

this clinical she did "basic nursing skills like ADLs, assist with ADLs,

feeding,...turning the patient, assist with turning and

positioning...check the resident's chart, read the care plan about the

resident."

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g. She completed her medical surgical clinical in Virginia. As part of this

clinical she said she "read a patient chart, vital signs . . . you learn about the

diseases, the treatments, and the disorders . . . you read the care plan of the

patient . . . you learn about giving injections, you learn about finger sticks,

oxygen, this kind of stuff." She did not personally administer injections.

When asked what skills she demonstrated she said, "I do . . . blood pressure,

vital signs, ... positioning the patient, ... raise the head of the bed, ... make

sure they are comfortable, feeding the patient . . . assist with ADLs." The

clinical was Monday through Friday for five to six weeks from 6:30 to 3:00.

h. She completed three days of geriatric theory from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

before she completed her geriatric nursing clinical at Facility 3. Her

clinicals lasted for one week from 6:30 to 3:00. As part of this clinical she

stated that she "assisted with ADLs, bathing, feeding, . . . make sure they

are comfortable . . . read charts." Later she stated she also observed and

practiced working with g-tubes.

i. Her pediatrics class lasted for four to six weeks and the pediatrics clinical

was for one week at Facility 4 from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. with a thirty-

minute lunchbreak. As part of this clinical she said she would "take care of

the newborns . . . take vital signs, monitoring them . . . if there is any distress

we post to the supervisor." She said that the clinic was for kids from birth

to adolescence but did not know if it was an inpatient or outpatient facility.

At first, she said the parents were not present, then she said she did not

remember if the parents were present, and then she said that the parents were

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present. When she was asked what hands-on care she provided, she stated

that she washed the children and did vital signs. When asked what vital

signs she obtained, the Respondent stated, "70 over 90 . . . the systolic is

110, ... the systolic is 90, 90 over ... adults is 120 over 80." When asked

again what vital signs she obtained for the pediatric patients she said, "100

over 70."

j. She said her maternity clinical was conducted at the same facility as the

pediatric clinical (Facility 4). As part of this clinical she stated that she

"observed . . . the pregnant patients . . . do vital signs . . . assist them with

ADLs, assisted with positioning, . . . like if they are in distress like to like

to put a pillow up under their head." She also said she monitored the

patients, assisted patients with going to the bathroom, and wrote notes in a

"notebook."

k. She said that her mental health clinical was at Facility 5 – "a lockdown unit

for dementia patients." She said as part of this clinical "we did charts, we

did diagnosis, we did treatments, ... you follow the policies of the lockdown

unit . . . you read about their medications, you read about their treatment . .

. and then you make sure they don't go out of the building." When asked

what skills she demonstrated, she said "we assist them in bathing, . . . dress

them, assist in feeding because some of them forget to eat." She also said

she observed the nurse give medication and she would assist with walking

the dementia patients. When asked what hands-on things she did, she stated

that she checked blood sugar and did finger sticks.

DISCUSSION

14. The Respondent submitted a Maryland LPN application with fraudulent information about

her LPN School, including fraudulent dates of attendance, and submitted a fraudulent transcript,

resulting in the Board issuing an LPN license to the Respondent in June 2019. The Respondent did

not meet the Board's statutory and regulatory requirements, didactic and clinical training, for LPN

licensure by exam and practiced on the fraudulent LPN license. The Respondent's continued

practice poses a serious risk and danger to the public health, safety, and welfare.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

Based on the foregoing investigative findings and reasons, the Board finds that the public

health, safety or welfare imperatively requires emergency action in this case pursuant to Md. Code

Ann., State Govt. § 10-226(c)(2) (2021 Repl. Vol.).

ORDER

It is hereby:

ORDERED that pursuant to the authority vested in the Board of Nursing by Maryland

Code Ann., State Govt. § 10-226(c)(2) (2021 Repl. Vol.) the license of Saffie Daffia to practice

as a licensed practical nurse in the State of Maryland is hereby SUMMARILY SUSPENDED;

and be it further

ORDERED that there will be a Show Cause Hearing on Wednesday, March 23, 2022 at

11:00 a.m. before the Board at the Maryland Board of Nursing offices, 4140 Patterson Avenue,

Baltimore, Maryland 21215: and be it further

ORDERED that if, the suspension of the Respondent's license is continued following a

Show Cause Hearing, the Respondent has the right to a full evidentiary hearing before the Board

and a hearing will be scheduled before the Board if the Respondent submits a written request for

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an evidentiary hearing to the Board no later than thirty (30) days from the date of the Board's

written decision issued after the Show Cause Hearing; and be it further

ORDERED that if the Respondent does not submit a timely written request to the Board

for an evidentiary hearing within 30 days from the date of the Board's written decision issued after

the Show Cause Hearing, the Respondent shall have waived all rights now and in the future to any

hearing on the merits of the summary suspension of the Respondent's license and the factual

allegations contained in this Order for Summary Suspension; and it is further

ORDERED that this Order for Summary Suspension shall remain in effect and the

summary suspension of the Respondent's license shall continue until further Order of the Board;

and it is further

ORDERED that this, "Order for Summary Suspension of Licensed Practical Nurse

License" is a **PUBLIC RECORD** pursuant to Md. Code Ann., General Provisions § 4-101 et seq.

& § 4-333 (2019).
