All individuals attending the Maryland Board of Nursing Forensic Nurse Examiner Training program who wish to practice as a Forensic Nurse Examiner-Pediatric (FNE-P) must complete the entire didactic portion (30 hours) of The Maryland Board of Nursing Forensic Examiner Training Program-Pediatric Curriculum and the entire clinical portion (32 hours) of FNE-P.

Note: The Pediatric didactic or clinical components cannot begin until the FNE Candidate has completed all requirements for the Adult/Adolescent certification.

It is highly preferred by the Board of Nursing that this clinical component be completed right after completion of the didactic portion The FNE candidate must complete all components of the program within a 12 month period after completion of the didactic component or repeat the entire didactic and clinical program.

EVIDENTIARY EXAM ON THE PEDIATRIC PATIENT

Objectives:

- 1. To define the three purposes of evidence collection on pediatric victims of sexual assault and abuse.
- 2. To independently perform a pediatric sexual assault forensic exam observed by a Maryland Board of Nursing certified RN-FNE or other medical provider that has been deemed an expert in the field of child sexual abuse.
- 3. To observe the forensic pediatric interview process performed by a trained nurse examiner, pediatrician, or child therapist.
- 4. To be familiar with the physical examination of the pediatric sexual assault client, collection of evidence and documentation process.
- 5. To meet all clinical competencies as set by your institution's Forensic Nurse Examiner program.

Suggestions for meeting these objectives:

• These objectives may be met by arranging to meet with an experienced and MBON certified RN-Forensic Nurse Examiner and preceptor or pediatrician identified as an expert in the field of child sexual assault/abuse in your jurisdiction.

Note:

• FNE Candidates should complete a minimum of 4 exams. The FNE Candidate, Preceptor, or Program Coordinator may require additional exams. A minimum of three total exams must be observed on females.

Clinical Hours: An evidentiary examination usually takes 2-4 hours per case. Total time to meet this objective is 16 hours.
